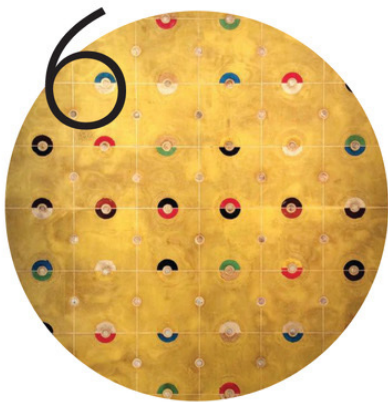
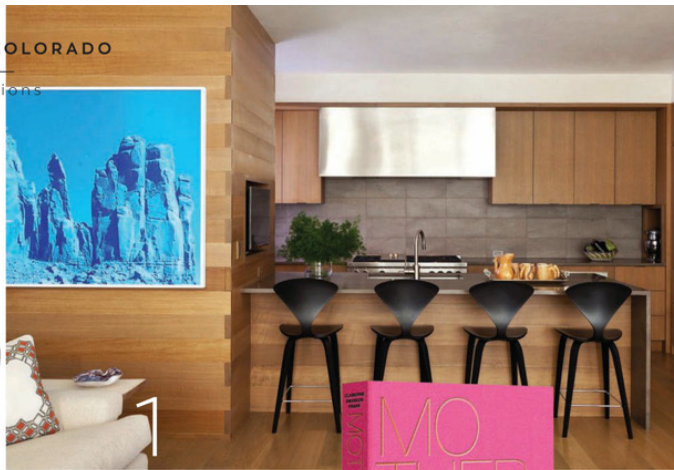
With offices in Aspen and Dallas, Demesne (demesne.design) founders Richard Mullen and Jamie Olsen Ali curate stylish selects for elevated living.

2. For a pop of pink, new book **Mother and Child** (\$85, Assouline) by photographer Claiborne Swanson Frank features a compelling modern cover, beautiful mother-child imagery and easy-to-read profiles.

3. It's important to have personalized pieces in your house that are still high design. You can elevate **children's photography and artwork**, which provide surprise and delight in a luxury project.

4. During our travels, we constantly find inspiration from nature, like this **flowering prickly pear cactus** from a recent trip to the desert. The rich variety of colors—earth tones with pops of bright colors—is inspiration for our current project in Moab, Utah.
